- **Commuter Grantee:** A CAMP grantee that serves primarily students who drive daily to school.
- **Commuter/Residential Grantee:** A CAMP grantee that serves both commuter and residential students.
- **Residential Grantee:** A CAMP grantee that serves primarily students who live on campus.
- **Four-Year Grantee Institution:** A grantee institution that offers a four year, BA/BS degree to students.
- **Two-Year Grantee Institution:** A grantee institution that offers a two-year AA degree to students.
- **CAMP Average:** The mean score for all CAMP grantees.
- **Cohort:** All grantees funded within a given fiscal year (e.g., 2009 Cohort)






Chart 4. GPRA 2: Percent of 1st Yr. Completers Who Continue



Chart 5. Cost per 1st Yr. Completer




Chart 5 shows the cost per 1st Yr. Completer at University of Washington and the average cost per 1st Yr. Completer at other types of grantees.

Chart 6. Efficiency Measure: Cost per 1st Year Completer Who Continues


